# Acceptable Use of Mobile Phone / Similar Device Guidelines<sup>1</sup>



### Description

Mobile phones/similar devices<sup>2</sup> have become an important and invaluable part of our modern lifestyle. There are times when possession of a mobile phone/similar device can provide a sense of safety and security while travelling to and from school.

Mobile phones/similar devices are unnecessary during school hours as a method of communicating with students given the primary school setting. There are also concerns about the misuse of mobile phones/similar in a school environment e.g. bullying, interruptions in class, distraction, inappropriate photography.

#### **Aims**

- The school aims to provide a happy, safe and stimulating learning environment for all students. The purpose of this policy is to ensure that mobile phone/similar device usage does not disrupt the learning environment. The policy seeks to clarify the responsibilities of staff and students with regard to mobile phones/similar devices. Implementation
- In general, students should not bring valuable items to school as they can be easily lost or stolen, which is often distressing for a child. Any person who brings property onto the school site do so at their own risk.
- If a mobile phone or similar devices for example apple/android watches with communication capacity are required at school for the reasons of safety for travelling to and from school, the student is required to deliver the phone/similar device to the school office for safe keeping. Phones/similar device are to be switched off before handing them into the office in the morning. Phones must be clearly labelled with the child's name and class. Phones/similar device are to be collected from the office at the end of the school day.
- Parents and students are advised that in bringing mobile phones/similar devices to school, they are doing so at their own risk and must comply with this policy and all Child Protection regulations.
- Any important messages can be conveyed to students by phoning the school office. The message will be relayed to the student. Should students need to make contact with anyone during the school day, they can speak to their teacher or go to the office to request that a phone call be placed on their behalf.
- No mobile phones/similar device are to be taken on excursions.
- All students found to be using the mobile phone/similar devices in an inappropriate manner e.g. bullying, inappropriate photography or texts, will have the phone confiscated and returned to the parent. The student would also be subject to disciplinary action at the school level and could also be referred to police.
- These procedures apply equally to the inappropriate use of tablets, portable computer games, iPods and similar devices, for example, apple/android watches with communication capacity.

## **Evaluation**

• This policy will be reviewed at least every 5 years or as deemed necessary by the school community.
